

COMMUNICATING SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

Enhance your transversal skills for in scientific communication

(EMERGE Blended Intensive Program for PhD students & early career researchers)

This training program aims to support the **professional development of PhD students and early career researchers** in the areas of **supervision, scholarly communication and outreach**. It offers **three digital sessions** and **one intensive week presential course**, with cultural, international, and interdisciplinary activities.

Some of the topics include advantages of open access for visibility to peers and society; the OA publishing landscape: avoiding traps; best practice for fostering independence in doctoral candidates in their transition to researchers; common challenges and how to tackle them: time management, doctoral candidate support, and early issue identification to ensure a smooth research journey; outreach through chronicles, podcasts and videos.
